THE PICNIC BOAT

Going out for a sunset cruise on a Hinckley Picnic boat is a luxurious endeavor, but beneath the teak and cherry the Picnic is a hard-core craft. First launched in the early nineties, the original made waves for its jet propulsion technology, which allowed for a quiet ride, tight turns, and the ability to navigate shallows a prop drive could never attempt. Now, nearly twenty years later, there's a new 36-foot Picnic on the water. As always, each one is custom, and the 1920s-inspired silhouette remains very much the same, with the exception of a raised pilothouse deck and a deeper V hull. Most important, it holds a whopping eleven people for a booze cruise. \$875,000, hinckleynachts.com

When the weather gets rough, you can button up the pilothouse and close the windows with the flick of a switch.

The cabin below deck sleeps two for overnight cruises and includes a full galley kitchen and head with shower.



The Picnic's JetStick steering system lets you turn on a dime, at any angle, at any speed — all while holding a cup of coffee in the other hand.
